REMEMBRANCE: PAGES OF THE SEA.

Film-maker Danny Boyle invites you to join him in marking 100 years since Armistice and the end of the First World War. Today, 11 November 2018, communities will gather on beaches across the UK to say goodbye and thank you, to the millions of men and women who left their shores during the war, many never to return. Swansea Bay has been chosen as one of the beaches where, over the course of several hours, a portrait of an individual from the First World War will emerge from the sand. As the tide rises, it will wash away as we take a moment to say a collective goodbye. Activities begin at 11.30am at the beach front near the Civic Centre, Swansea and include the reading of a poem written by Carol Ann Duffy especially for Pages of the Sea.

GENERAL DATA PROTECTION REGULATION 2018

The General Data Protection Regulation (*GDPR*) 2018 replaces the existing law on data protection (*the Data Protection Act 1998*) and gives individuals more rights and protection in how their personal data is used by organisations. Parishes must comply with its requirements, just like any other charity or organisation. The process has already begun in Killay and will be launched in Tycoch on Sunday 18th November. The congregation of the **Parish of Killay** are reminded that it is vitally important to fill in the consent and declaration forms to enable us to keep you informed about activities, and for us to claim back gift aid on your contributions (*if you are a tax payer*). If you haven't had a form, then you will find them at the back of church. For the congregation at the **Parish of Tycoch**, letters and consent forms will be available from next Sunday (*18th*). 
LITURGY OF THE WORD

Collect

Almighty Father, whose will is to restore all things in your beloved Son, the King of all: govern the hearts and minds of those in authority, and bring the families of the nations, divided and torn apart by the ravages of sin, to be subject to his just and gentle rule; grant this for the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, to whom with you and the Holy Spirit, be the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

A reading from the Book of Jonah. (Ch.3 v.1-5,10)

The word of the Lord came to Jonah a second time, saying, 'Get up, go to Nineveh, that great city, and proclaim to it the message that I tell you.' So Jonah set out and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the Lord. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly large city, a three days' walk across. Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's walk. And he cried out, 'Forty days more, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!' And the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast, and everyone, great and small, put on sackcloth. When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil ways, God changed his mind about the calamity that he had said he would bring upon them; and he did not do it.



A reading from the Letter to the Hebrews. (Ch.9 v.24-28)

Christ did not enter a sanctuary made by human hands, a mere copy of the true one, but he entered into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God on our behalf. Nor was it to offer himself again and again, as the high priest enters the Holy Place year after year with blood that is not his own; for then he would have had to suffer again and again since the foundation of the world. But as it is, he has appeared once for all at the end of the age to remove sin by the sacrifice of himself. And just as it is appointed for mortals to die once, and after that the judgement, so Christ, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will appear a second time, not to deal with sin, but to save those who are eagerly waiting for him.

Psalm 62. 5-12

5. Wait on God alone in stillness, O my soul; for in him is my hope.

6. He alone is my rock and my salvation; my stronghold, so that I shall not be shaken.

7. In God is my strength and my glory, God is my strong rock; in him is my refuge.

8. Put your trust in him always, my people; pour out your hearts before him, for God is our refuge.

9. The peoples are but a breath, the whole human race a deceit; on the scales they are altogether lighter than air.

10. Put no trust in oppression, in robbery take no empty pride; though wealth increase, set not your heart upon it.

11. God spoke once, and twice have I heard the same; that power belongs to God.

Glory to Christ our Saviour

Mark. (Ch.1 v.14-20)

After John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God, and saying, 'The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news.' As Jesus passed along the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the lake – for they were fishermen. And Jesus said to them, 'Follow me and I will make you fish for people.' And immediately they left their nets and followed him. As he went a little farther, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John, who were in their boat mending the nets. Immediately he called them; and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired men and followed him.
