ELECTION OF NEXT BISHOP OF MONMOUTH:

St.Woolo's Cathedral in Newport will be closed and locked on Tuesday as an Electoral College of people drawn from all over Wales, will meet inside to nominate and then vote on a confidential list of candidates. The meeting of the College follows the recent retirement of Bishop Richard Pain, who served as Bishop of Monmouth for nearly six years. The new bishop will be the 11th Bishop of the Diocese of Monmouth, an area covering the south-east corner of Wales to the border with England. The Electoral College will have up to three days to reach a decision. If an election is made, the Archbishop of Wales, John Davies, will unlock and open the west door of the Cathedral and formally announce the name of the Bishop-Elect. Please remember the members of the Electoral College in your prayers as they seek to be led by God in this hugely important task.

Collect

God, who in generous mercy sent the Holy Spirit upon your Church in the burning fire of your love: grant that your people may be fervent in the fellowship of the gospel that, always abiding in you, they may be found steadfast in faith and active in service; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. **Amen**

A reading from the Book of the Exodus. (Ch.32 v.7-14)

The Lord said to Moses, 'Go down at once! Your people, whom you brought up out of the land of Egypt, have acted perversely; they have been quick to turn aside from the way that I commanded them; they have cast for themselves an image of a calf, and have worshipped it and sacrificed to it, and said, "These are your gods, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt!" The Lord said to Moses, 'I have seen this people, how stiffnecked they are. Now let me alone, so that my wrath may burn hot against them and I may consume them; and of you I will make a great nation.' But Moses implored the Lord his God, and said, 'O Lord, why does your wrath burn hot against your people, whom you brought out of the land of Egypt with great power and with a mighty hand? Why should the Egyptians say, "It was with evil intent that he brought them out to kill them in the mountains, and to consume them from the face of the earth"? Turn from your fierce wrath; change your mind and do not bring disaster on your people. Remember Abraham, Isaac, and Israel, your servants, how you swore to them by your own self, saying to them, "I will multiply your descendants like the stars of heaven, and all this land that I have promised I will give to your descendants, and they shall inherit it for ever." And the Lord changed his mind about the disaster that he planned to bring on his people.

A reading from the First Letter of Paul to Timothy. (Ch.1 v.12-17)

I am grateful to Christ Jesus our Lord, who has strengthened me, because he judged me faithful and appointed me to his service, even though I was formerly a blasphemer, a persecutor, and a man of violence. But I received mercy because I had acted ignorantly in unbelief, and the grace of our Lord overflowed for me with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. The saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners — of whom I am the foremost. But for that very reason I received mercy, so that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display the utmost patience, making me an example to those who would come to believe in him for eternal life. To the King of the ages, immortal, invisible, the only God, be honour and glory for ever and ever. Amen.

Year C – The Thirteenth Sunday after Trinity

Psalm 51: 1-10

- 1. Have mercy on me O God in your enduring goodness; according to the fullness of your compassion blot out my offences.
- 2. Wash me thoroughly from my wickedness; and cleanse me from my sin.
- 3. For I acknowledge my rebellion; and my sin is ever before me.
- 4. Against you only have I sinned and done what is evil in your eyes; so you will be just in your sentence and blameless in your judging.
- 5. Surely in wickedness I was brought to birth; and in sin my mother conceived me.
- 6. You that desire truth in the inward parts; O teach me wisdom in the secret places of the heart.
- 7. Purge me with hyssop and I shall be clean; wash me and I shall be whiter than snow.
- 8. Make me hear of joy and gladness; let the bones which you have broken rejoice.
- 9. Hide your face from my sins; and blot out all my iniquities.
- 10. Create in me a clean heart O God; and renew a right spirit within me.

Glory to Christ our Saviour

Luke. (Ch.15 v.1-10)

All the tax-collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to Jesus. And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, 'This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them.' So he told them this parable: 'Which one of you, having a hundred sheep and losing one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the one that is lost until he finds it? When he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders and rejoices. And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and neighbours, saying to them, "Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep that was lost." Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance. 'Or what woman having ten silver coins, if she loses one of them, does not light a lamp, sweep the house, and search carefully until she finds it? When she has found it, she calls together her friends and

neighbours, saying, "Rejoice with me, for I have found the coin that I had lost." Just so, I tell you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents.'
